Construction Craft Laborers (CCL)

Enjoy one of the most diverse trades in the industry. Become a part of a team that builds:

- High-rises and other commercial structures
- Water mains, sewers and underground utilities
- Warehouses, mills and factories
- Light-rail systems and airports
- Highways, stadiums and bridges
- Pipelines and demolition



Apprenticeship Program

The two-year program consists of 4000 hours of paid on-the-job training (OJT) and 360 hours of required related classroom training (RT). There are four terms (6 months per term of 1000 OJT hours and 90 RT hours).

***FREE COLLEGE CREDIT OPTIONS**

First-term wages are based on 63% of the Journey worker wage and increase progressively as your knowledge and skills grow and you advance into the next term. *(A raise every six months!)*

You will receive your on-the-job training by working with a CCL Journey worker who will mentor and instruct you on the varied skills needed to perform the work of our trade. You will be working in indoor and outdoor environments, in all weather conditions, performing physically demanding tasks that require critical thinking and technical skills.

Upon successful completion of the program, you will earn a nationally recognized CCL Journey worker credential!

The selection process is based on the following criteria:

Apply to the program online at www.oregonlaborers.com

Meet the minimum qualifications (age and education) and complete the orientation

Attend an interview

Successfully complete our Hands-On Skills Assessment (HOSA) class.

MINIMUM REQUIREMENTS

- **Must be at least 18 years old**
- **Be a high school graduate or have a GED or NCRC Bronze level**



During this week, you will attend an apprenticeship orientation, an OSHA 10 construction safety class, learn basic safety skills and procedures, tools and material recognition and traffic control.
