ACE Mentor Program of Oregon awards \$115,000 in college scholarships to Portland-area seniors

PORTLAND, OREGON – The ACE Mentor Program of Oregon last week awarded **\$115,000** in scholarships to **16 Portland-area seniors** interested in pursuing careers in architecture, construction and engineering.

The local ACE program has awarded more than \$1 million in scholarships to over 200 Oregon students since its inception in 2006. These young people are emerging as promising talent in their fields.

"It was great to have our ACE teams meet in person again this year, which is a huge benefit to both our students and mentors," said ACE Board Member Jeff Becksfort of PAE, one of ACE's longtime lead mentors.
